

2019-2020 Annual Action Plan Substantial Amendment

Introduction

This is an Amendment to the City of San Mateo's 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan that was originally submitted to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in June 2019, and amended in September 2020.

This amendment is to reflect the change in the City's budget to increase the total for Community Funding by \$820,745 due to funding provided to the City through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act).

CDBG Program

The City has an allocation of \$820,745 from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act). This will be used to augment the existing Rental Assistance project and to add a new project to assist stabilization of Child Care microbusinesses. The significant increase in funding and addition of a new project requires the plan to be amended.

The following are the revised texts to the 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan.

- 1) AP-12 Participation will add Community Resources Commission meeting on 11/18/20 and City Council meeting on 1/4/21.
- 2) AP 15 Expected Resources will add \$820,745 in CDBG-CV funds due to new funds from the CARES Act.
- 3) AP 20 Annual Goals and Objectives. Community Funding program funding will increase by \$820,745 and outcomes will increase 75 for persons assisted and 30 for businesses.
- 4) AP 35-Add Project 7. CV-[Microbusiness Assistance]
- 5) AP 38 Projects will add \$520,745 in CDBG-CV funds to Project 6 CV-[Rental Assistance] and increase households assisted by 75. Add new project CV-[Microbusiness Assistance], include \$300,000 to the Child Care Coordinating Council of San Mateo County (4Cs) to provide economic assistance to stabilize childcare microbusinesses who have been impacted by the pandemic. Add the following entry into the AP38 Chart:
