

2018-2022 Consolidated Plan Substantial Amendment

Introduction

This is an Amendment to the City of San Mateo's 2018-2023 Consolidated Plan (ConPlan) that was originally submitted to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in June 2018, and amended in September 2020.

In accordance with the City's Community Participation Plan, any revisions to the ConPlan, that includes the addition of a new project or activity or a change in funding by more than 50%, requires an amendment to the Plan. This amendment is to reflect the change in the City's budget to increase the five year total for Community Funding by \$820,745 due to funding provided to the City through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act).

CDBG Program

The City has an allocation of \$820,745 from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act). This will be used to augment the existing Community Funding, which is budgeted at \$520,000 for the five-year program and had a previous substantial amendment to add \$439,938 from an earlier allocation of CARES Act funding. This substantial increase in program funding requires the plan to be amended.

The following are the revised texts to the 2018-2022 Consolidated Plan.

- 1) PR 15 Citizen Participation will add Community Resources Commission meeting on 11/18/20 and City Council meeting on 1/4/21.
- 2) SP 35 Anticipated Resources will add \$820,745 in CDBG-CV funds due to new funds from the CARES Act.
- 3) SP 45 Goals Summary will add \$820,745 in CDBG funds to Goal #2 Community Funding and increase persons assisted by 75 and businesses by 30. Eligible CDBG activities include, but are not limited to, assisting low- and moderate-income households with rental assistance for no more than six months, grab and go/delivery meal programs, and support of other COVID-19 response services to individuals and microbusinesses.
