An improvement project is coming to your neighborhood.

PROJECT DETAILS:

The Laurie Meadows Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Improvement Project was approved by San Mateo City Council on May 17, 2021, awarding the contract to McKim Corporation.

The project will improve high visibility crosswalks, ADA-compliant sidewalk ramps, and traffic calming bulb-outs.


Additionally, the project will install Class II bike lanes in both directions and will slurry seal the entire length of Laurie Meadows drive.

ANTICIPATED SCHEDULE:

Work is expected to begin the first week of June and conclude by September.

Work hours are: 7:30 am to 4:30 pm Monday through Friday. Construction Notices will be issued from the contractor.

PRIVATE SEWER LATERAL

San Mateo property owners are required to maintain the functionality of their sewer lateral (the pipe from your property to the sewer main under your street). To find out more about sewer laterals and our shared cost program, go to: www.cityofsanmateo.org/PSLO.

SIDEWALKS

San Mateo property owners are legally and financially responsible for maintaining the sidewalk fronting their property in accordance with Municipal Code Chapter 17.24.

Looking to make improvements?

To protect its investment in street paving, the Department enacts a three-year street digging moratorium on all recently paved roads. Property owners considering improvements that may affect the street should complete their work prior to the City's upcoming project identified on the other side of this card.
