You can help influence how voters elect future City of San Mateo Council Members by joining the Represent San Mateo initiative! The City has begun the process of transitioning to district elections, and community input is needed. Currently, voters across the entire City elect all five City Council members through an at-large elections system. A district-based election is one in which the City is divided into separate districts, each with one City council member who resides in the district and is chosen by the voters in that particular district.
