Traditional Districting Principles

Preventing a Districting from Becoming a Gerrymander

There are a number of criteria that have been used nationally and upheld by courts.

- Relatively equal size – people, not citizens
- Contiguous – districts should not hop/jump
- Keep districts compact – appearance/function
- Maintain “*communities of interest*”
- Follow city/county/local government lines


- Keep Neighborhoods Together

- It follows themes seen throughout the COI Forms and email submissions, as well as staff input, hand drawn maps, DistrictR maps, and geographic analysis.




Draft Map 2

- It follows themes seen throughout the COI Forms and email submissions, as well as staff input, hand drawn maps, DistrictR maps, and geographic analysis.





Total Deviation: 9.87%


- This plan splits **three neighborhoods**.








