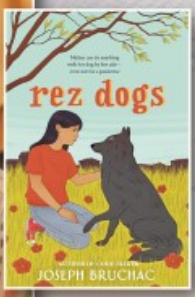




# SAN MATEO COUNTY READS

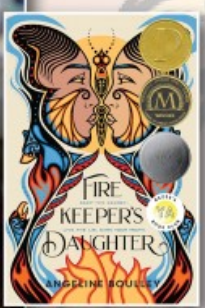


### Joseph Bruchac

Author Joseph Bruchac, Rez Dogs is a highly acclaimed children's book author, poet, novelist and storyteller, as well as a scholar of North American culture.

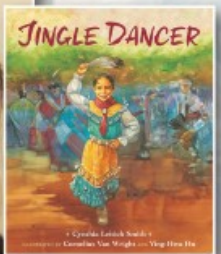


### Angeline Bouley
