

RESOLUTION NO. 124 (1993)

ESTABLISHING THE DOWNTOWN HISTORIC DISTRICT

RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Mateo, California, that:

WHEREAS, the City of San Mateo supported the preparation of a survey of the City's historic buildings by the San Mateo County Historical Association;

WHEREAS, this survey was done using National Register of Historic Places criteria;

WHEREAS, this survey was accepted by the State of California Department of Parks and Recreation, Office of Historic Preservation;

WHEREAS, this survey found that the majority of structures along portions of East Third Avenue and South B Street retain a high degree of physical and architectural integrity and historic significance;

WHEREAS, this area of downtown represents the early commercial development of San Mateo in the late 1800's and early 1900's.

WHEREAS, the General Plan Open Space and Conservation Element and Downtown Specific Plan include policies to establish and protect the downtown historic district identified in the 1989 survey;


WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the protection, perpetuation and use of structures within the historic district is of economic, cultural and aesthetic benefit to the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS DETERMINED and ORDERED, that:

1. The Final EIR for the revised Downtown Specific Plan as certified by the City Council on June 6, 1993 analyzed the impacts of establishing the downtown historic district.

2. The City Council approved, by at least a majority of its members, the establishment of the Downtown Historic District, as shown in Exhibit A, attached.

Downtown Historic Preservation Plan


