CITY LIBRARIAN'S MESSAGE

This past year has been one of transformation and possibility for the San Mateo Public Library. We developed a new strategic plan and vision that will guide our work for the next three years. Our new vision, to cultivate boundless potential through exploration, learning, and connection, reflects our deep commitment to serving the evolving needs of our community. We are already making meaningful progress toward the goals we set in our strategic plan.

In April, the library hosted the third annual San Mateo Celebrates event during National Library Week. This citywide arts and culture festival brings people of all ages and backgrounds together to connect through shared experiences at the library. As an intergenerational “third space,” the library plays a crucial role in addressing social isolation, especially at a time when loneliness has been declared a national epidemic. In a city like San Mateo, where the senior population is growing, these inclusive, community-building efforts are more important than ever and align with City Council priorities.

San Mateo Celebrates is one example of how the library reaches new audiences, but outreach is part of our work year-round. Over the past year, library staff engaged with residents across the city and expanded access through the purchase of a new outreach van, which will deliver library services and resources directly to neighborhoods. We continue to approach our work through an equity lens, ensuring that everyone in San Mateo feels welcomed and supported at the library.

Construction began on the Marina Library’s structural improvement project, ensuring the branch will continue to serve the community for generations. Recognizing that our branches are vital community anchors, we expanded programming at the Hillsdale branch, including the launch of a popular romance book club and crochet group.

Looking ahead, we remain committed to promoting literacy, re-imagining spaces to meet evolving needs, and expanding outreach. Above all, our goal is to ensure the San Mateo Public Library continues to be a place where every member of our community can discover, connect, and learn.

The library made new connections in the community with outreach to seniors, veterans, residential communities, and our neighbors in North Central San Mateo this year.


In celebration of National Library Week, the library hosted a Community Resource Fair at the Martin Luther King, Jr. Center, with eight government and nonprofit organizations.

The film tells the story of the quiet revolutionaries from the pioneering women behind the *“Free Library Movement”* to today’s librarians who provide service to the public despite working in a contentious age of closures and book bans.

The film chronicles those who created a civic institution where everything is free and the doors are open to all. The film was followed by a discussion with the filmmakers, Dawn Logsdon and Lucie Faulknor, library staff, and a Library Board member.

As the Library's **2018-2023 strategic plan** came to a close, the work began to set the course for **2024-2028**.

Through a series of planning sessions with committed stakeholders, feedback from almost 700 surveys (in 3 languages), and careful consideration of upcoming challenges, a new guiding document was created to let everyone connected with the library know who we want to become and what we want to accomplish.

MARINA BRANCH RESTORATION PROJECT

An exciting new chapter is underway with the restoration of the **Marina Branch Library**. This comprehensive project, expected to span approximately 16 months, will deliver critical upgrades to enhance the safety, accessibility, and longevity of the facility. Planned improvements include:

- **Foundation and structural repairs**
- **Mechanical, electrical, and plumbing upgrades**
- **Accessibility improvements**
- **Exterior and landscaping improvements**
- **Newly updated interior**
- **Relocated deck**

This project is supported in whole or in part by funding provided by:

- The State of California, administered by the California State Library;



- A Community Project Funding Grant, administered by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development; and
- A Member Agency Grant administered by the Peninsula Clean Energy Authority.


To ensure continued service during construction, a temporary satellite branch will operate at the Shoreview Recreation Center, offering holds pick up and limited programming.
